On the way to the Buttes the group may encounter late-departing Swainson's Hawks or even a Merlin.

The trip will be lead by Eric DeFonso. Eric is an avid local birder, the field trip coordinator for Fort Collins Audubon, and an educational bird-handler at the Rocky Mountain Raptor Program. He is currently researching and writing a guidebook to the birds and bird sounds in movies and television
